

Board of Supervisors Principles

Emerging Technologies should promote:

- The net common good
- The safety, needs, and convenience of humans
- The needs of the most vulnerable members of our community
- Public safety
- Pay for direct & indirect costs on public infrastructure
- Data sharing with public agencies
- Evaluation of impact on public spaces
- Labor rights
- Appropriate labeling for business information
- Protect private information of individuals
- Public-private partnerships
- Regulation that is nimble and responsive

Definition: Emerging Technology

Emerging technologies include new technologies, applications of technology, and business models that:

- Are in development and have only been tested at market level on a limited basis;
- Will have a measurable impact economically, socially, or morally in the next five to ten years; and,
- Do not fit within existing regulatory code.
